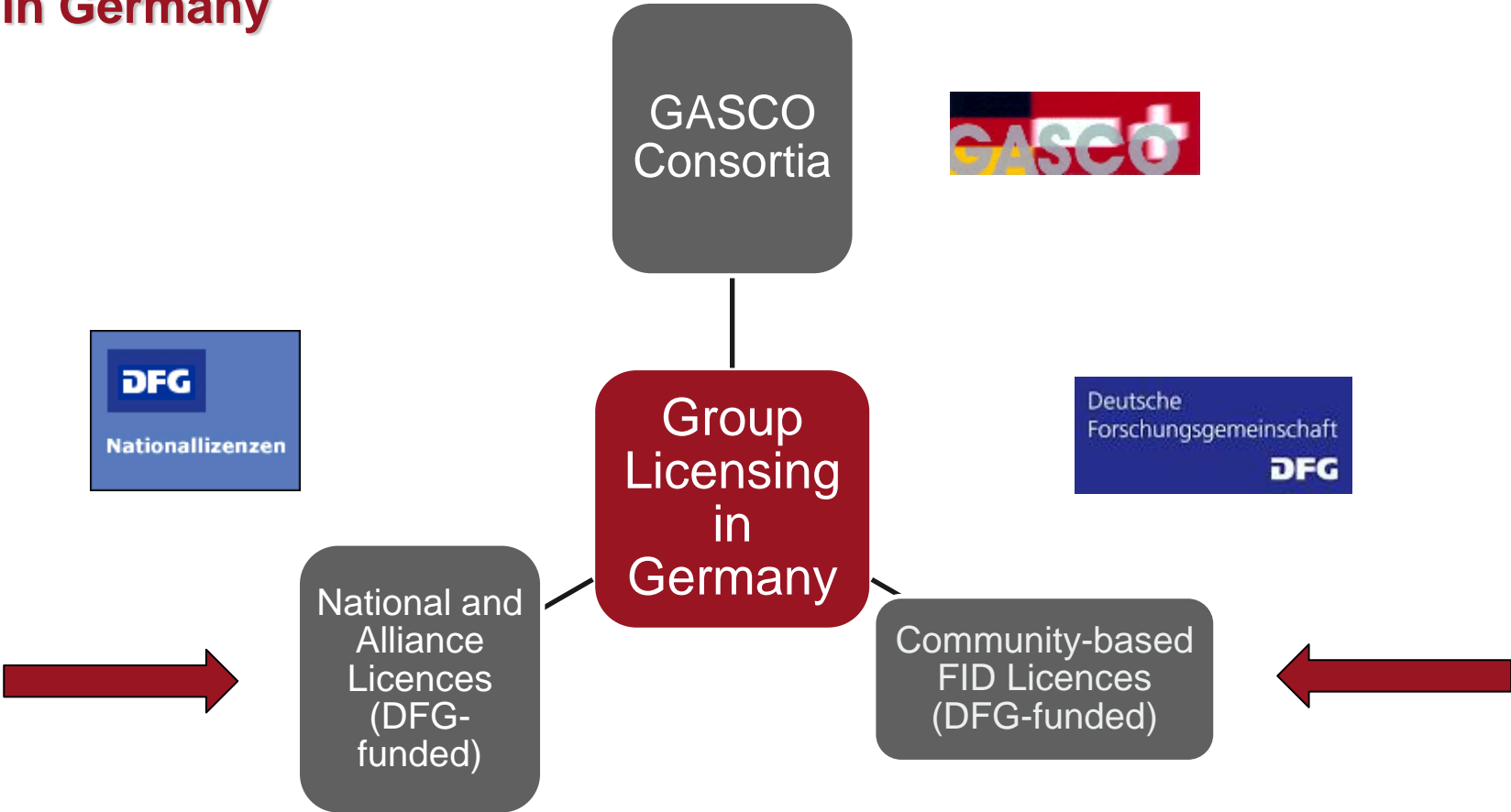

DFG-funded licensing at the national level (1)

- Role of **DFG (German Research Foundation)** in the library landscape
 - Scientific Library Services and Information Systems Programme
 - Aim of setting up nationwide efficient research information systems
 - **Special Subject Collections System (SSG)**: Aims at enabling researchers in Germany of all disciplines to access specialised literature
 - Complements the information infrastructures of the universities and research institutions by offering supraregional services for peak demand
 - System run by libraries with nationwide significance for the respective subject areas
- **National licensing programme (2004-2010)**
 - Purchase of completed backfile content in one-off payment for nation-wide access with perpetual access/hosting rights
 - Full funding by DFG



DFG-funded licensing at the national level (2)

- Alliance licensing programme (2011-)
 - Built on opt-in pilot for electronic journals for 12 publishers (2008-2010)
 - Context: **Priority Initiative "Digital Information"** as a joint initiative of the Alliance of German Science Organisations
 - > Action field national licensing
 - Opt-in models for current content products
 - 25% DFG funding of overall cost
- Transition from Special Subject Collections System (SSG) to **Scientific Information Services (FID)**
 - Current restructuring process with particular focus on the **development of community-based licensing of peak demand digital resources (FID licences)**
