- **5 CONTRACT MANAGEMENT**

- **5.1** Consortium and Publisher shall evaluate the Publisher's execution of the performance under the Agreement at least twice each year. The Consortium is authorised to represent the Institutions in this regard and to act on their behalf. The Institutions are entitled to take part in this evaluation.
- **5.2** For contract management at least the following shall be evaluated: the degree to which Publisher executes the performance as laid down in the Agreement and the Licence Agreements, the reports handed over (e.g. on Open Access), the invoicing and payment, possible improvements in the performance (changes, additions etc.), the innovation opportunities and the degree to which service levels are complied with. In the meeting, the general findings of all Parties about the quality of the provision of services shall be discussed, as shall the escalations and potential problems. In this context, possible measures for improvement shall also be discussed.
- **5.3** Publisher shall deliver a full report of all articles (Open Access and otherwise) published by the Institutions over the period 1 January until 30 June and 1 July until 31 December. The report gives an overview of the name of the Submitting Author; Institution; article title; DOI; clickable DOI; journal title; OA licence applied; date first published online; journal APC. The report shall be delivered within 4 weeks after the end of the 6 month periods.
- **5.4** When setting up the workflow for Open Access, Publisher will consult with dedicated library staff. Parties shall agree to and evaluate relevant workflows and tools with regard to Open Access publishing regularly.

#### License Terms For Institutions

##### Amended Clauses

Clauses 1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3, 4.1, 9.3, 14.1, 14.11 shall be deleted and replaced with the following:

- **1** Definitions - "Authorised User" an individual who is either a current student, current or retired faculty member or other member of staff of Licensee, and whom is authorised by the Licensee to access the Licensee's information services via the Secure Network from a terminal at the Licensee's library premise or offsite via a secure link to a valid IP address on the Secure Network. Such definition shall further include an individual who is not a current student, faculty member or other member of staff of the Licensee, but who is permitted to access the information services via the Secure Network from a terminal at the Licensee's library premises.
- **3.1.2** Incorporate parts of the Products in printed and electronic course packs, study packs and resource lists. Each item shall carry appropriate acknowledgement of the source, listing title and copyright owner. Content in non-electronic non-print perceptible form, such as Braille, may also be offered to Authorised Users in compliance with the Marrakesh Treaty to facilitate access to published works for persons who are blind, visually impaired or otherwise print disabled
- **3.1.3** Licensee may supply to the library of an institution via Inter-Library Loan (whether by post, fax or secure transmission, using Ariel or its equivalent, whereby the electronic file is deleted immediately after printing) a single paper copy of an article or section of a Product in accordance with the limitations agreed with the Licensor and provided that such copy may only be used for research, teaching and private study purposes and not for any Commercial Use.
- **4.1** Except in the course of exercising rights specifically granted in this Agreement or permitted under any applicable Creative Commons license, the licensee takes responsible endeavours to:
- **9.3** Licensee shall pay the Fees within 30 days of the date of invoice unless different payment provisions are set out in the invoice. Without prejudice to any other right or remedy that Licensor may have, where Licensee fails to pay the Fees and any VAT or other applicable sales tax on the due date, Licensor shall be entitled to:
- **14.1** This Agreement may not be assigned by either party to any other person or organization, nor may either party subcontract any of its obligations, without the prior written consent of the other party, for which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- **14.11** This Agreement and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with it or its subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims) is subject to Swiss Law. The parties submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the Swiss courts to settle any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with this Agreement or its subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims)

##### Additional Clauses

The following new clauses shall be added:

- **2.2.1** The Licensor grants an unlimited number of simultaneous users to licenced content.
- **2.5** In the event a journal volume is transferred to another publisher, Licensor shall use commercially reasonable endeavours to negotiate such continued access rights with the new publisher, following NISO RP-24-2015 (the Transfer Code of Practice).
- **2.6** Authors from a Consortium Member are permitted, free of charge, to store (self-archive) the Accepted Manuscript of their articles in a departmental, institutional, or non-commercial subject repository:
- **2.7** In the case of an STM (Science, Technology and Medicine) journal, after an embargo period of 6 months; and
- **2.8** In the case of an HSS (Humanities and Social Sciences) journal, immediately.
- **2.9** Authors from a Consortium Member are further permitted, free of charge, to store (self-archive) the abstract of the Accepted Manuscript of their articles, together with a link to the Version of Record on [cambridge.org](http://cambridge.org), on a commercial repository or social media site.
- **4.4:** Where Licensor is no longer able to provide Online Access on a permanent basis, it shall:
- **4.4.1** provide a copy of the Purchased Products in pdf format (or such other electronic format as Licensor in its sole discretion determines) and Licensee procures that each Consortium Member agrees and acknowledges that the use of any such electronic copy shall always be subject to the terms of this Agreement.
- **4.4.2** make reasonable efforts to ensure continued access through Portico, CLOCKSS, or a similar third party archive.

- **6.6** Publisher shall provide customer support services to the Contact Person of the Institution by e-mail or over the phone. This includes answering e-mail queries about the use, functionality and content of the Licensed Material within 48 hours.
- **6.7** Publisher shall provide the Institution with support to enable End-Users to make optimum use of the Licensed Material.
- **8.3** Neither party's delay or failure to perform any provision of this License Agreement, as result of circumstances beyond its control (including, without limitation, war, strikes, floods, governmental restrictions, power, telecommunications or Internet failures, or damage to or destruction of any network facilities) shall be deemed to be, or to give rise to, a breach of this License Agreement.
- **10.4** In case of termination of this License Agreement, the Licensor and the Licensee agree on the following in terms of the availability of the Licensed Material in the Web-Scale Discovery Service of the Licensee: If, at termination of this License, the metadata (of the fulltexts), for which archiving rights are granted under this License Agreement, are still available in the Web-Scale Discovery Service of the Licensee, these metadata shall be available to the Licensee and its authorised users in the Web-Scale Discovery Service. If, at termination of this License, the metadata (of the fulltexts), for which archiving rights are granted under this License Agreement, are no longer available in the Web-Scale Discovery Service of the Licensee, the Licensor shall provide the Licensee with the metadata of the Licensed Material, for which archiving rights are granted under this License Agreement, in machine-readable format. The Licensee shall be permitted to set up a local metadata resource for integration in its Web-Scale Discovery Service. The Licensee shall provide access to the metadata, references and fulltext of the Licensed Materials in its Web-Scale Discovery Service are to authorised users only.
- **10.5** Opt out clause: Member Institutions may terminate their agreement if sufficient funds are not provided or allotted in the library budget for the products by the appropriate body in the Member's institution. The Vice Chancellor of the Member's institution shall provide a written statement to the CUP in which the Vice Chancellor confirms the significantly decreased budget allocation to the Member Institution. Notice of such a decision must reach the CUP by 1 November at the latest for implementation at the commencement of the next calendar year. In this case a member institution's consortium participant fee will be deducted from the invoice. Once the cumulative value of opted-out institution(s) represents more than 20% of the annual license value, the Publisher reserves the right to renegotiate the terms of the agreement. If in 2025, the cumulative value year used would be the 2024 license value.

- **13.1** Mandatory duties of disclosure according to Swiss law remain reserved (e.g. in accordance with BGÖ, BöB)

### Price conditions

- Existing members will have their fee increased or decreased or stayed flat depending on their publishing output and existing spend.
  - Members that pay above the price per article of £2,500 will have their fee reduced by 2% per annum.
  - Members that have an average price per article between £2,000 and £2,500 will have zero increase for the duration of the agreement.
  - Members that pay below the price per article of £2,000 will have their fee increased by 7%. This percentage increase will then be the same for 2025 and 2026.
- This new deal provides for unlimited free APC's for article publishing within CUP's Hybrid and Gold OA journals submitted by eligible corresponding authors affiliated with one of the participating CSAL members.
- Cambridge University Press are pleased to offer CSAL members a 10% discount on the standard APC prices in the new Gold OA series Prisms and Research Directions, as listed under Schedule 4. APCs for all accepted articles are sent directly to the contact point at the institution. The institution will be billed for any accepted articles minus the discount. No prepayment or deposit is required.
- The VAT calculation is based on the collections licensed for the relevant year. The more that is published by the participating institutions, the faster the transformation to Publish. Should the Publish figures increase and the value of the collection decrease (as we anticipate to happen each year due to CUP's transformative OA strategy) then these two factors work to transform the Read portion of the license to Publish. CUP anticipates the Publish % to increase more aggressively in the coming years. This calculation has been devised in order to reflect the most accurate view of Read vs. Publishing per deal.
- 75% DDP is agreed for additional print subscriptions for journals within the annual collections.
- CSAL Members maintain perpetual access rights to all titles in their respective licenced collections for the years paid. This includes not only the institutional subscription holdings but also the titles that make up the remainder of the collection. This does not include backfile years that are free with a current licence.

### New Members

Other CSAL members may join the Licence Agreement at a fee to be determined by the Publisher.

### Flipping Journals: from the standard Full Collection to the Prisms and Research Directions

It is not CUP's goal to move more content from the standard Full Collection to any of our Gold OA series. However, we cannot ensure that this will not happen in the future. Therefore, Cambridge University Press can guarantee that should this happen during the term of this agreement (2024-2026), we will honor the terms of the deal and CSAL Members will continue to be able to publish in the affected journal(s) free of charge.

### Journals Leaving the Collections

If Cambridge University Press ceases to publish a journal then this journal will no longer be available in the packages on offer. The availability of titles in Cambridge Journals Online Collections will be reviewed annually. Cambridge will notify the Consortium of any titles leaving the list of available titles by 1 October.

Should the value of the collection decrease by more than 10% year on year, then adjustments will be made to the members' Flat Fees. By contrast, should the value of the collection increase by more than 10% year on year, we reserve the right to adjust the members' Flat Fees. Cambridge University Press will communicate any such adjustments in advance.

### Moving Wall – Swiss National Licence

The Moving Wall refers to the annual current content for the licensor's Full Journals Collection. This is a dynamic product in that the Moving Wall for current content is added annually and made available after completing a 5 year embargo period to all Authorised Institutions in Switzerland. The Moving Wall includes all newly published and takeover titles that are included in the Full Journals Collection in any given year.

The Moving Wall commenced with the year 2016 content and imposes a 5 year embargo. Based on an agreement commencing in 2016, the National Licence was extended to include the 2016 Full Journals Collection as of 1 January 2022. As of 1 January 2023, the National Licence was extended to include the 2017 Full Journals Collection.

With the continuation of the agreement for 2024-2026, the Moving Wall will now include the years 2016 - 2026 content based on an agreement commencing during 2020. The 2024 content will become available in the national license in 2030 and so on.

- As of 1 January 2024, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2018 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2025, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2019 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2026, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2020 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2027, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2021 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2028, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2022 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2029, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2023 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2030, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2024 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2031, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2025 Full Journals Collection.
- As of 1 January 2032, the National Licence will be extended to include the 2026 Full Journals Collection.

The fee for the Moving Wall is offered in 4 tiers and is waived as long as the 95% - 100% (Tier 1) of the value of the CSAL licence for current content is maintained. For reference purposes, the 2024 value of the licence is £453,774.00. The licence fee for the current content that would need to be maintained will increase using the negotiated increase between the Consortium of Swiss Academic Libraries (CSAL) and Cambridge University Press. Should the annual accumulated CSAL licence fees not be maintained, the Moving Wall fee will be incurred and based on the value of the CSAL licence for current content that is renewed. Tier 2, 3 or 4 would be then applicable as follows:

Gold OA: the journal accepts only OA articles. Authors can publish OA articles without paying an APC thanks to this agreement.

Gold OA (no APC): the journal accepts only OA articles. Authors can publish OA articles and they don't need to pay an APC (= Diamond journals).

Hybrid OA: the journal accepts OA and non-OA articles. Authors can publish OA articles without paying an APC thanks to this agreement.

N/A (Non-Journal Product): there is no research content.

No OA: the journal has research articles, but it does not accept OA articles.

Research Open: all the research articles are Gold OA, there is still a substantial amount of non-research content that is important to the journal. This content is behind a paywall but offered at a lower subscription rate. Authors can publish research articles without paying an APC thanks to this agreement.

OA by arrangement: the journal does accept OA articles, but authors will need to discuss with the societies.

## Schedule 5

### Access & Metadata

1. The Press's Shibboleth service manages access to Cambridge Core and some of its other online services based on (i) eduPersonPrincipalName (ePPN) or (ii) eduPersonScopedAffiliation (ePSA) or (iii) eduPersonScopedAffiliation (ePSA) in combination with eduPersonEntitlement (ePE); at the present time, the Press does not request/require other attributes.

Attributes are used solely during authentication as the basis of the basic access control decision and are subsequently discarded. No attribute or other information is retained or displayed on-screen in Press services (including Cambridge Core). Attributes are not used to provide a persistent user experience across multiple sessions. It is conceivable that the provision of a persistent user experience across multiple sessions based on privacy-preserving attributes would be one of the objectives of future development work, particularly if there is demand for this feature from access federations and/or Identity Providers. Persistent user experience across sessions will not, however, be implemented or introduced in a manner inconsistent with the policies, rules and standards of Identity Providers from the various access federations of which the Press is a member.

2. The Publisher sends the following data to ProQuest/ExLibris monthly: Journals metadata XML feed. Ebooks metadata XML. MARC records for all ebooks published on Cambridge Core. Proquest /ExLibris also pick up our KBART lists from the page above to create corresponding collections in their systems. The Publisher has regular meetings with staff from ProQuest and ExLibris to check on data and discuss any customer questions. Processes do not always run smoothly with such a complex chain of interactions between different systems, but the Publisher endeavours to fix any problems quickly if they arise.

Cambridge Core does not provide an OAI-PMH-compliant metadata retrieval service. The Publisher is developing a Core API that would support metadata harvesting at scale of the kind described, but for the time being, in the absence of a dedicated tool for this purpose, they are unable to comply with this clause today. They do however provide our metadata to the Swiss consortium (to an FTP location) to permit this form of indexing.

3. All standard sales collections are described in KBART format, plus full title lists of All Books and All Journals are available in KBART format for customer use. These can be found at: <https://www.cambridge.org/core/services/librarians/kbart>. Specific MARC records and KBART files can also be sourced from within your logged-in administrator account on Cambridge Core.

## Schedule 6

### Double Dipping & Green Open Access

Cambridge University Press have a Double Dipping Policy to reduce hybrid journal subscriptions to prevent charging both authors and subscribers for Open Access content <https://www.cambridge.org/core/services/open-access-policies/open-access-journals/double-dipping-policy>

Starting in 2018, we define double-dipping as occurring when Open Access content effectively replaces subscription (non-Open Access) content. Where non-Open Access content in a journal has been reduced over a 4-year rolling window as a result of the publication of Open Access articles, the Open Access portion of the journal's content is acknowledged through a reduction in subscription prices over the following three years.

The Open Access landscape continues to evolve. We will be conducting further reviews of our journals pricing policy in order to continue to operate a fair and sustainable model, and as a result our new double-dipping policy is likely to be revised within three years. The following steps are followed to calculate double-dipping:

- i. Step 1 – Assess the change in non-OA articles over the past 4 years
- ii. Step 2 – Assess how many of the OA articles double dipped, if any

There is no double-dipping if there is no drop in the number of non-OA articles.

If the number of OA articles is less than the drop in non-OA articles, then all the OA articles are considered to be double-dipping.

If the number of OA articles is equal to or greater than the drop in non-OA articles, then the number of double-dipping OA articles is the drop in non-OA articles.

- iii. Step 3 – Calculate the value of double dipping by dividing the total APC revenue in the analysis year by the total number of OA articles and then multiply by the number of double dipping OA articles.
- iv. Step 4 – Determine the discount for the pricing year by spreading the discount over three years, so we take one-third of the double-dipping revenue as a percentage of the subscription revenue and apply this as a discount % in the pricing year (for example, 2019) and the two subsequent years (2020 and 2021).

This discount will return the full value of the double-dipping in three years. This double-dipping policy took effect in 2018 any discounts would be applied to 2020 prices. If in 2019 the journal publishes more double-dipping articles, then a new discount will be added to the 2018 discount for the next pricing year (2021).

Subscribers already receiving a substantial discount on a journal's subscription price, via a consortium/national licence, for example, will not receive an additional discount on their collection access fee as a result of these changes due to already heavily discounted fees.

### Green Open Access

Subscription journals published by Cambridge University Press:

- allow Green OA with no embargo period (HSS journals) or six-month embargo period (STM journals) for the 'Accepted Manuscript'. The accepted manuscript is the version of the paper that has been submitted to a journal, peer-reviewed and accepted for publication but not yet copyedited or typeset or had any other publishing processes applied (such as adding metadata). Please see below for more details.
- after an embargo of five years, allow Swiss institutions and authors affiliated to the institutions as defined under Authorised Users in this contract, to upload the 'Published PDF' (with publisher's layout and pagination) in non-commercial discipline-specific and/or institutional repositories and make them available in Open Access. For the avoidance of doubt, archive content allow Green OA for the 'Published PDF' for authored or co-authored articles for authors with permanent residence in Switzerland and affiliated to the institutions as defined under Authorised Users in this contract, after the five year embargo has expired.
- offer immediate Gold OA through a hybrid option for subscription journals (including journals published on behalf of learned societies), or if published in wholly OA journals, on payment of a one-off Article Processing Charge (APC)
- offer authors the flexibility of a range of Creative Commons licenses for Gold OA, allowing them to choose whichever matches their particular funding and publishing requirements.
- do not charge both authors and subscribers for OA content, as detailed in our double-dipping policy statement.

## Schedule 7

## Transformative Agreement Clauses

**Transformative Agreement FOR CONSORTIA:**

**This additional clause uses the following defined terms:**

**Article:** a research, case report, brief report, review or rapid communications format article (as defined by Licensor).

**Article Processing Charges (APCs):** the fee a publisher will sometimes charge for making articles Open Access.

**Cambridge Core:** Licensor's online platform for books and journals.

**Cambridge OA Journals:** journals which offer an OA publishing option.

**Eligible Corresponding Author:** a current Consortium Member student or member of staff who handles the manuscript and correspondence during an Article's publication process – from manuscript correction and proof reading, to the revisions and re-submission of revised manuscripts up to acceptance. They (a) have the authority to act on behalf of all co-authors in all matters pertaining to publication of the manuscript including supplementary material (b) are responsible for informing the co-authors of the manuscript's status throughout the submission, review, and publication process (c) act as the point of contact for any enquiries after an Article is published and (d) are affiliated to any of the institutions listed under Schedule 2.

**Creative Commons Licence:** a type of licence allowing an author to communicate which rights they reserve and which they agree to waive in order to enable end-users to benefit from a gratis right to reproduce and distribute (and make derivative works from) the original Article. Licensor offers CC-BY, CC-BY-NC-SA, and CC-BY-NC-ND, each described in more detail on the Creative Commons website.

**Open Access/OA:** a publishing model that allows content to be published digitally and made accessible without charge to the end-user (subject to the terms of an applicable Creative Commons Licence).

**OA Publishing Services:** the opportunity to publish Articles in Cambridge OA Journals without paying an APC.

**Payment Processing Software:** RightsLink or other payment processing software

**Year:** calendar year.

*Any other defined terms in this Schedule shall have the meaning given in the Licence Terms for Institutions.*

#### 1. OA publishing process

- 1.1. Corresponding Authors have the opportunity to publish OA Articles in Cambridge OA Journals without incurring any Article Processing Charges.
- 1.2. In order to publish in a Cambridge OA Journal, the Corresponding Author must:
  - 1.2.1. have an Article accepted for publication;
  - 1.2.2. provide details of his/her affiliation with Licensee, when submitting their Article for publication ; and
  - 1.2.3. sign a licence to publish form or equivalent documentation, as required by the Cambridge OA Journal publishing the Article, selecting a Creative Commons Licence in the process.
- 1.3. The OA publishing opportunities the Agreement offers are only available for Articles which have an acceptance date during the Term of this Agreement.
- 1.4. Articles published non-OA in Cambridge OA Journals during the Term of this Agreement will be eligible for retroactive conversion to OA provided:
  - 1.4.1. the Article was published during the Term of this Agreement;
  - 1.4.2. the request to convert to OA is made within the same Year the Article was published (for example, an article published in March 2021 non-OA will need to be made retroactively OA before the end of 2021 – only the Corresponding Author can request their Article be made OA and this must be done through Payment Processing Software, or correspondence directly with the Licensor);
- 1.5. If a Cambridge OA Journal is transferred to another publisher during the term of this Agreement:
  - 1.5.1. Articles which were accepted for publication will still be published in the Cambridge OA Journal, provided there is space to do so in a journal volume published before the transfer;
  - 1.5.2. All retroactive OA requests must be complete prior to the date of content file transfer to the new OA journal publisher.
- 1.6. Notwithstanding clause 1.3, if a journal is transferred to Licensor during the term of this Agreement:
  - 1.6.1. Articles which were accepted for publication before the Agreement started will be eligible for OA publication provided that, post-transfer, the journal is: (a) either hybrid or Gold OA and (b) included in Licensee's package of Subscription Products.

**2. Licensor's Responsibilities**

## 2.1. Licensor shall:

- 2.1.1. verify the identity of Corresponding Authors after the acceptance of Article manuscripts, via affiliation, email domain, or ORCID.
- 2.1.2. provide Consortium Members with a list of the Cambridge OA Journals;
- 2.1.3. provide reports to each Consortium Member detailing their respective publishing outputs, including the following information: name of Corresponding Author, institution name, article title, DOI, journal title, eISSN, print ISSN, OA licence applied, date first published online, Journal APC and author email; and
- 2.1.4. host information relating to the OA publishing opportunities it offers on Cambridge Core.
- 2.1.5. facilitate retroactive OA publishing, as described in clause 1.4 – 1.5.

**3. Consortium Member responsibilities**

- 3.1. Consortium Members shall inform their researchers and authors about the Licensor's OA publishing process.

**4. Exceptions and Exclusions.**

- 4.1. Some of Licensor's journals currently do not permit OA publishing. As such, OA publishing will initially not be available in those journals. These journals will become eligible for OA publishing on an annual basis, if and when OA options are introduced by the journal's proprietors.
- 4.2. Although Licensor endeavours to include all Cambridge OA Journals in this agreement, it reserves the right to exclude a journal.

**5. Fees**

- 5.1 The Subscription Fee is split into two parts to correctly describe the products and services being delivered:

- 5.1.1. A 'Read' fee, for the supply of the Subscription Products; and
- 5.1.2. A 'Publish' fee, for the provision of the OA Publishing Services

- 5.2. The split of the Subscription Fee is as follows:

## LICENCE TERMS FOR CONSORTIA

### 1 DEFINITIONS

In this Agreement the following words shall have the following meanings:

**Agreement:** the Contract Form and these Licence Terms;

**Authorised User:** (i) any current student or member of staff of Consortium Member who is authorised by a Consortium Member to access the Secure Network; and/or (ii) any individual granted temporary permission by a Consortium Member to access the Secure Network whilst on its premises;

**Commercial Use:** for the purposes of direct or indirect financial gain (whether by or for Licensee, a Consortium Member, an Authorised User, or any other person or entity) by means of sale, resale, loan, transfer, hire or other form of exploitation of the Products. For the avoidance of doubt, Commercial Use shall not include use by Licensee, Consortium Member or by an Authorised User of the Products in the course of research funded by a commercial organisation or recovery of administrative charges by Licensee or Consortium Member from Authorised Users;

**Consortium Member:** an educational institution listed in the Contract Form (as may be amended from time to time) which is a member of the Licensee and has agreed to only access and use the Product allocated to it in the Contract Form in accordance with the terms of this licence;

**Contract Form:** the form setting out the Products that Licensee wishes to either purchase or subscribe to for access and use by Consortium Members, together with the relevant fees and, in relation to Subscription Products, the Subscription Period;

**Fees:** as applicable, the Subscription Fees, and the Purchase Fees;

**Licensee:** the consortium or organisation detailed in the Contract Form;

**Licensor:** The Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge acting through its department Cambridge University Press of University Printing House, Shaftesbury Road, Cambridge CB2 8BS, UK;

**Online Access:** access to the Products on the Server;

**Products:** as applicable, Purchased Products and Subscription Products;

**Purchase Fees:** the fees set out in the Contract Form for the supply of Purchased Products;

**Purchased Products:** products which Licensee has purchased on a 'perpetual access' basis (i.e. the Licensee pays a one-time licence fee for the right to permanent access to the applicable products, although other charges may also apply);

**Secure Authentication:** Athens or Shibboleth (SAML) technology-based authentication, IP ranges, username and password, or such other authentication process agreed between Consortium Member and Licensor from time to time, and which is consistent with current best practice;

**Secure Network:** a network (whether a standalone network or a virtual network within the internet) which is only accessible to Authorised Users whose identities are authenticated by Consortium Member at the time of login (and periodically thereafter in line with best practice) by Secure Authentication;

**Server:** either Licensor's server or a third-party server designated by Licensor on which Products are mounted and via which they may be accessed;

**Subscription Fees:** the fees set out in the Contract Form for the supply of Subscription Products during the Subscription Period;

**Subscription Period:** the period commencing on the date set out in the Contract Form and during which the relevant Consortium Member and the Authorised Users may access the Subscription Products;

**Subscription Products:** products to which Licensee has subscribed for an agreed period;

**TDM:** Text and data mining; and

**Terms of Use:** the permitted uses and restrictions of use of the Products as set out in clauses 3 and 4.

### 2 LICENCE

21 Subject to payment of the Purchase Fees, Licensor grants Licensee a non-exclusive and non-transferable right to give each Consortium Member access to and use of the Purchased Products in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Where Licensor is no longer able to provide Online Access on a permanent basis, it shall provide a copy of the Purchased Products in pdf format (or such other electronic format as Licensor in its sole discretion determines) and Licensee procures that each Consortium Member agrees and acknowledges that the use of any such electronic copy shall always be subject to the terms of this Agreement.

22 Subject to the payment of the Subscription Fees, Licensor grants Licensee a non-exclusive and non-transferable right to give each Consortium Member access and use of the Subscription Products in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

23 Subject to clause 2.4, any journal volume to which Licensee has paid for its Consortium Members to have Online Access for the Subscription Period shall continue to be accessible via Online Access after that Subscription Period has expired, provided that this Agreement is not terminated by the Licensor under clause 10.2. This continuing access shall not apply to any content provided free of charge as an additional benefit to online subscribers. The terms of this Agreement shall continue to apply to any journal volume to which access is granted after its Subscription Period has expired.

24 Where Licensor is no longer able to provide Online Access to the Subscription Products on a permanent basis, it shall provide a copy of the applicable Subscription Products in pdf format (or such other electronic format as Licensor in its sole discretion determines). Licensee accepts and acknowledges that, whilst Licensor cannot guarantee continued access, in the event a journal

volume is transferred to another publisher, Licensor shall use commercially reasonable endeavours to negotiate such continued access rights with the new publisher.

### 3 PERMITTED USES

#### General

31 Subject to the restrictions in clause 4.1, and solely for the purposes of research, teaching at Consortium Members' premises and private study Licensee may allow Consortium Members and Authorised Users to:

3.1.1 access, view, download, store and print the Products; and

3.1.2 incorporate links to the Products in electronic course packs or management systems.

3.1.3 Licensee may supply to the library of an institution (whether by post, fax or secure electronic transmission, provided that the electronic file is deleted immediately after printing) a single paper copy of a section of a Product in accordance with the limitations agreed with the Licensor and provided that such copy may only be used for research, teaching and private study purposes and not for any Commercial Use.

32 Nothing in this Agreement shall in any way exclude, modify or affect any of Licensee's statutory rights under applicable copyright law.

#### Text and data mining

33 Authorised Users may download, extract, store and index the Products for the purposes of TDM and may mount, load, integrate and analyse the results of TDM on their personal devices or Secure Network. Any copies of the Products accessed or reproduced by an Authorised User for the purposes of TDM must be deleted once the analysis of the results of the TDM is complete.

34 Authorised Users may use the results of their TDM in their research and make the results of their TDM publicly available, provided that no Product or part of a Product is reproduced within such research, other than as expressly permitted by applicable law.

### 4 RESTRICTIONS

4.1 Except in the course of exercising rights specifically granted in this Agreement or permitted under any applicable Creative Commons license, the Licensee shall not, and shall procure as a principle obligation that neither a Consortium Member nor any Authorised User shall:

4.1.1 remove or alter Licensor's copyright notice or other means of identification or disclaimers as they appear on a Product;

4.1.2 systematically make printed or electronic copies of any of the Products;

4.1.3 permit access to the Products to anyone who is not an Authorised User;

4.1.4 display or distribute any part of a Product on any electronic network, (including without limitation the internet and the world wide web) other than the Secure Network;

4.1.5 use all or any part of a Product for Commercial Use;

4.1.6 modify, adapt or alter a Product or make available a Product in any other form or medium or create derivative works from a Product without the prior written permission of Licensor;

4.1.7 create a database in electronic or structured manual form by downloading and storing any content from the Products;

4.1.8 attempt to interfere with the proper workings of any online provision of the Products including attempting to circumvent security, tamper with, hack into or otherwise disrupt or compromise the functionality or availability of the Server or other internet-connected device used as part of Licensor's IT system which enables access to the Products;

4.1.9 either individually or collectively download Product content at rate which exceeds 500 pdfs per hour;

4.1.10 use any automated retrieval devices (such as web robots, wanderers, crawlers, spiders of similar devices) save that this is not intended to prevent a Consortium Member from using a federated search engine or discoverability service as part of its library information services; nor

4.1.11 otherwise download, store, reproduce, transmit, display, print, copy, distribute, extract, exploit or use the Products.

4.2 The Licensee and Consortium Members are not permitted to supply the whole or part of any Product to another institution or library without the Licensor's prior written consent, except to the extent expressly permitted by applicable law.

4.3 Licensor reserves the right to withdraw access to the Products in the event of a download rate in excess of the limit in clause 4.1.9. The withdrawal of access in such circumstances is generated by an automatic abuse detection process. Upon activation of the process, e-mails including details of the actual download rate detected will be sent to Licensor's administrator, following which Licensor may contact Licensee's administrator to request an investigation. Licensor shall only restore access once the issue has been resolved to its satisfaction.

### 5 LICENSEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES

5.1 Licensee shall provide, or shall ensure that each Consortium Member provides, Licensor on request with all identifying information, including IP address ranges, relating to each Consortium Member and its Secure Network necessary to enable Licensor to set up and activate Online Access. Online Access is conditional upon this information being supplied to Licensor, and Licensee or Consortium Members promptly notifying Licensor of any changes to this information.

5.2 Licensee warrants and represents that the range of IP addresses provided further to clause 5.1 are only assigned to devices within each Consortium Member's Secure Network.

5.3 Licensee shall:

5.3.1 ensure Online Access is only granted to Authorised Users via the Secure

- Network and that access granted to such users ceases on them ceasing to be an Authorised User;
- 5.3.2 take all reasonable measures to monitor the use of the Products and shall make Authorised Users aware of the Terms of Use;
- 5.3.3 ensure that all Authorised Users treat all logins, passwords or other Authorised User identification required for Online Access as confidential and do not disclose them to any other person;
- 5.3.4 ensure that all Authorised Users only use the Products in compliance with the terms of this Agreement; and
- 5.3.5 and shall ensure that each Consortium Member shall, promptly notify Licensor on becoming aware of any unauthorised possession or use or other breach of this Agreement and take appropriate action (including disciplinary action) to ensure that such activity ceases and to prevent any recurrence.
- 5.3.6 Licensee and each Consortium Member is responsible for obtaining at its own cost all internet connections, equipment and software necessary to access the Products via the Secure Network. Furthermore, whilst Licensor will use commercially reasonable endeavours to guard against viruses, it does not guarantee or warrant that any Products or Online Access will be free from infections, viruses and/or other code that has contaminating or destructive properties and Licensee and each Consortium Member is responsible for implementing sufficient procedures and virus checks to satisfy its requirements for the security of data input and output.
- 6 LICENSOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES**
- 6.1 Following activation of Licensee's account Licensor shall, subject to payment of the Fees, use commercially reasonable endeavours to:
- 6.1.1 provide each Consortium Member with Online Access; and
- 6.1.2 ensure that the Server has sufficient capacity and rate of connectivity to provide Licensee and each Consortium Member with a level of service which is commensurate with the current standards in the online information industry sector.
- 6.2 Licensor may temporarily suspend Licensee's Online Access for the purposes of maintenance or upgrades but shall use its commercially reasonable endeavours to notify Licensee and each Consortium Member of such activities and to minimise the period of suspension or interruption.
- 6.3 In relation to any Product made available via Online Access, Licensor reserves the right at any time on notice to Licensee to:
- 6.3.1 make changes or corrections and to alter, update or upgrade any aspect of the Product;
- 6.3.2 vary the technical specification of the Product or of any software included therein; and
- 6.3.3 withdraw the Product (or any part of a Product) where it has decided to cease publication of that Product.
- 6.4 Where Licensor withdraws a Product or a part of a Product in accordance with clause 6.3.3, if Licensee purchased the withdrawn Product on a perpetual access basis, a copy of the withdrawn Product shall be provided in pdf format (or such other electronic format as Licensor in its sole discretion determines), otherwise Licensor may in its sole discretion either offer broadly equivalent replacement materials or a credit in respect of the unexpired portion of the Subscription Fees in relation to the withdrawn Product (or part of a Product). The provision of a pdf copy, replacement or credit (as applicable) shall discharge Licensor's liabilities to Licensee in respect of the withdrawn Product (or part of a Product).
- 6.5 For such period that a Consortium Member is entitled to Online Access, Licensor agrees to provide Consortium Member with access to usage data and, where available, usage reports detailing the level of use of any Subscription Products by Consortium Member's Authorised Users per month. Any reports made available shall be COUNTER compliant (or compliant with an equivalent industry standard), and such reports and data will not identify individual Authorised User usage, but will be provided in respect of the IP address ranges provided further to clause 5.1. Licensor will not be able to provide accurate usage data and/or reports if Consortium Member stores any of the Subscription Products on any cache or proxy server, which is discouraged in any event due to the dynamic nature of the Subscription Products.
- 7 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**
- 7.1 Products, usage data and usage reports are protected by international copyright laws, database rights and other intellectual property rights. Licensor, its affiliates and licensors are the owners of these rights, and this Agreement does not transfer any right, title or interest in the Products to Licensee or Consortium Members.
- 7.2 Licensor warrants that use of the Products in accordance with these terms does not infringe the intellectual property rights of any third party.
- 8 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY**
- 8.1 Whilst Licensor shall use commercially reasonable endeavours to provide Online Access, it cannot guarantee that Online Access will operate continually or without interruption, and neither does Licensor guarantee the accuracy of any information and/or content contained in the Products, which are provided on a strictly 'as is' basis. Licensor has no liability for any loss or damage whatsoever sustained by Licensee, a Consortium Member or any Authorised User as a result of the availability or use of or reliance on the content in the Products.
- 8.2 Save as expressly provided otherwise in this Agreement, Licensor, to the fullest extent permitted by law, excludes all express or implied terms, conditions, warranties and/or representations with regard to the Products including, without limitation, any warranties relating to quality or fitness for purpose.
- 8.3 Licensor shall not be liable for any indirect or consequential loss or damage or for any loss of or corruption of data, loss of programs, profit, anticipated savings, revenue or goodwill (whether direct or indirect) arising out of or in connection with the access, availability, use of or reliance on the Products.
- 8.4 Licensee agrees that the entire liability of Licensor to Licensee and any Consortium Member or Authorised User for any claim (whether in contract, tort, misrepresentation, breach of statutory duty or otherwise) arising out of or in connection with the access, availability, use of, or reliance on a Product shall be limited to the Fees paid for that Product in the year in which the liability arose in relation to that Product.
- 8.5 Nothing in this Agreement shall limit or exclude Licensor's liability for death or personal injury resulting from Licensor's negligence or its fraudulent misrepresentation or any other liability which cannot be limited or excluded under applicable law.
- 9 FEES**
- 9.1 The Fees are net of all applicable taxes, including without limitation VAT or other applicable sales taxes, which shall be charged in accordance with the relevant regulations in force at the time of making the taxable supply, and such amounts shall be payable by Licensee in addition to the Fees on receipt of a valid tax invoice.
- 9.2 Licensee shall pay the Fees in full without deduction or withholding in respect of any tax unless required by law. If any such deduction or withholding is required, Licensee shall, when making the payment to which the withholding or deduction relates, pay to Licensor such additional amount as will ensure that Licensor receives the same total amount that it would have received if no such withholding or deduction had been required.
- 9.3 Licensee shall pay the Fees within 30 days of the date of invoice unless different payment provisions are set out in the invoice. Without prejudice to any other right or remedy that Licensor may have, where Licensee fails to pay the Fees and any VAT or other applicable sales tax on the due date, Licensor shall be entitled to:
- 9.3.1 charge interest at a rate of 4% per annum above the base lending rate of Barclays Bank plc, accruing on a daily basis until the date of actual payment; and
- 9.3.2 delay the activation of or suspend access to the Products previously granted until full payment is made of any Fees, and Licensee agrees that the Subscription Period shall not be extended by any period of delay or suspension resulting from late payment.
- 10 TERM AND TERMINATION**
- 10.1 The Subscription Period may be renewed by mutual consent for additional periods upon payment of the agreed Subscription Fees.
- Either party may terminate this Agreement (and Licensor may terminate this Agreement in part) immediately by serving written notice on the other in the event that the other party commits a material breach of this Agreement, and in the case of a breach capable of remedy fails to remedy the same within 30 days of a written request to do so. Licensee, Consortium Member or an Authorised User's breach of clause 4 or clause 5 shall be deemed a material breach.
- 10.2 Upon termination of this Agreement by the Licensor under clause 10.2:
- 10.2.1 Licensee's, Consortium Member's and Authorised Users' rights to access and use the Products shall immediately terminate and Online Access shall cease;
- 10.2.2 Licensee shall immediately cease using any passwords or other Authorised User identification to access the Products;
- 10.2.3 Licensee shall ensure that all Consortium Members and Authorised Users shall do likewise; and
- 10.2.4 Licensor shall not be required to refund any Fees. Any copies of Product information and/or content shall be deleted from Licensee's and each Consortium Member's records and storage media.
- 10.3 On termination of this Agreement by the Licensee under clause 10.2, Online Access to the Products shall continue for the applicable Subscription Period or on a perpetual access basis, as appropriate, unless Licensor is unable to provide such access, in which case the relevant provisions in clause 2.1 shall apply.
- 11 DATA PROTECTION**
- 11.1 Licensor shall be entitled to:
- 11.1.1 hold and process the Consortium Members personal data as defined in applicable privacy and data protection legislation;
- 11.1.2 make such information available to: (i) business partners, sub-contractors and/or suppliers who provide products or services to Licensor; (ii) our branches; either of whom may be outside of the European Economic Area; for legal and administrative purposes and in order to fulfil its obligations under this Agreement. This Clause shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- 12 ANTI-BRIBERY AND CORRUPTION**
- 12.1 Licensee understands that Licensor acts in accordance with the UK Bribery Act 2010, Criminal Finances Act 2017 and other applicable anti-bribery and tax evasion laws in the jurisdictions in which it operates. The Licensee (and its related officers and employees) warrants that it (and Licensee confirms on behalf of each Consortium Member that they each) shall not engage in any activity, practice or conduct in relation to its performance under this Agreement which would constitute an offence under any applicable law or regulation relating to anti-bribery, corruption or tax evasion. The Licensee agrees to promptly notify Licensor of any suspected or known breach of this clause 12.
- 13 CONFIDENTIALITY**
- 13.1 In the course of negotiating the terms of this Agreement, Licensor shall from time to time disclose to Licensee information that is proprietary or confidential to Licensor. Licensee agrees not to disclose information it receives in pre-contractual negotiations in a way that could be prejudicial to Licensor, except as may be required by law, a court of competent jurisdiction or any governmental or regulatory authority. This clause 13 shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 14 GENERAL**
- 14.1 Licensee may not assign, transfer or sub-license its rights or obligations under this Agreement.
- 14.2 In no circumstances shall Licensor be liable to Licensee, Consortium Member or any Authorised User for any delay or failure to perform its obligations due to an event beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to loss or failure of third party controlled IT equipment and internet connections.
- 14.3 This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any previous agreement between the parties relating to its subject-matter. Each party acknowledges and agrees that, in entering into this Agreement, it does not rely on, and shall have no remedy in respect of, any

- statement, representation, warranty or understanding (whether negligently or innocently made) other than as expressly set out in this Agreement.
- 144 This Agreement may not be amended, varied or supplemented except in writing signed by duly authorised representatives of both parties.
- 145 If any provision of this Agreement (or any part of any provision) is found by a court to be unenforceable that provision or part provision shall, to the extent required, be deemed not to form part of this Agreement and the validity and enforceability of the other provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected.
- 146 No provision of this Agreement is intended to be enforceable by a person who is not a party to this Agreement.
- 147 Any notice given to a party under or in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered by hand or by pre-paid first-class post or other next business day delivery service at its registered office (if a company) or its principal place of business (in any other case) or sent by e-mail, if to Cambridge at [generalcounsel@cambridge.org](mailto:generalcounsel@cambridge.org), and if to the Licensee, at the e-mail address on the Contract Form. Any notice shall be deemed to have been duly received: if delivered by hand, on signature of a delivery receipt or at the time the notice is left at the proper address; if sent by pre-paid first-class post or other next business day delivery service, at 9.00 am on the second business day after posting or at the time recorded by the delivery service; if sent by e-mail, at 9.00 am on the next business day after transmission. This clause does not apply to the service of any proceedings or other documents in any legal action or, where applicable, any arbitration or other method of dispute resolution.
- 148 The rights of the parties arising under this Agreement shall not be waived except in writing. Any waiver of any of a party's rights under this Agreement or of any breach of this Agreement by the other party shall not be construed as a waiver of any other rights or of any other further breach.
- 149 Headings used in this Agreement are for convenience only and are deemed not to be part of the Agreement.
- 1410 This Agreement is drafted in the English language. If this Agreement is translated into any other language in the event of conflict the English language version shall prevail.
- 1411 This Agreement and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with it or its subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims) is subject to English Law. The parties submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts to settle any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with this Agreement or its subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims).
